

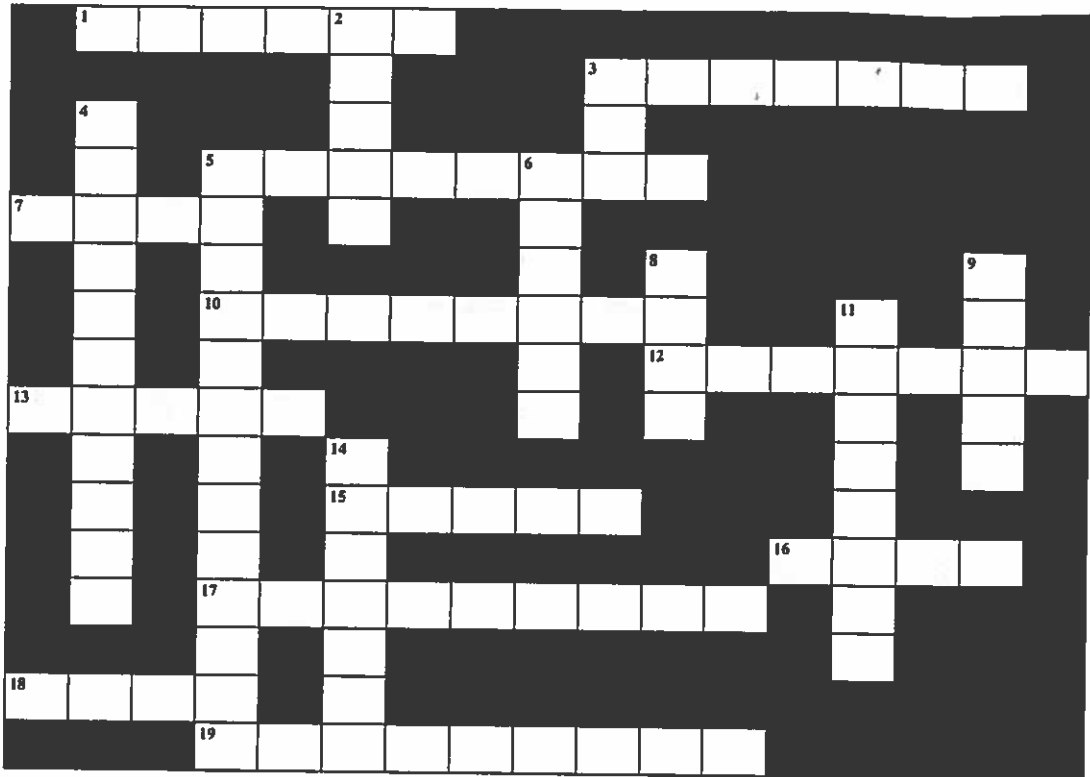
INTERPRETING THE BILL OF RIGHTS
